

You may know very little about **ConversaSpain** now, even though the name has some hints to it. However, where do we come from? ConversaSpain is a brand of Multilingual Education Development & Support that cooperates with the Regional Education Authority of the **Community of Madrid**, the **Region of Murcia**, the **Community of Castilla-La Mancha**, and the **Community of Castilla y León** to incorporate **Auxiliares de Conversación** (Language Assistants) in **public schools** in those regions. It was born because we believe experiencing a cultural exchange shapes people: not only our auxiliaries but also Spanish schools and their students.



In other words, we want to **walk this journey by your side**. And a journey would not be one without those who take it. And why should you? Because this international experience will bring you not only plenty of new adventures and personal growth, but it will also be an **impressive feat on your resume**. Employers understand the importance of life skills acquired from leaving the comfort of your home country. They value transferable abilities that Language Assistants will develop during this program such as problem-solving skills, cultural awareness, resilience, autonomy, and so on.

PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS

Before applying, please, make sure you meet the following:

- Be a native-level English speaker,
- have a passport valid at least until October 2024, from any of the following countries (due to specific agreements between these countries and the Spanish Ministry of Education):



*If you hold a passport from any of these countries, you also need to hold a C2 English Certificate (CEFR) or equivalent.

- hold a university/college degree (e.g.: Bachelor, Master, NQF7, Associate's, or equivalent) in any subject, or be enrolled, at least, in the second year of your university degree
- be **aged up to 59** at the beginning of the program, and
- have a clean background check.

VALUABLE BACKGROUND AND SKILLS:

- Studies related to the English language, linguistics, education, special needs, etc.,
- previous teaching experience,
- having lived abroad, and/or
- some knowledge of the **Spanish language**.

*You may have gap hours between lessons, but you can use them to do some lesson planning or just enjoy your leisure time! You will also have paid school holidays (summer period not included).

TASKS OF THE AUXILIARES DE CONVERSACIÓN

Language Assistants are considered pillars of public schools since this role is crucial in the foreign language classroom. You will have a very active role in supporting the main teacher and helping students improve their conversation skills. You will teach English to students who are in Preschool, Primary School, Middle School, High School, Vocational Colleges and/or Escuelas de Idiomas. However, you will not be responsible for grading or disciplining them. The specific activities and tasks will depend 100% on the school but, in general terms, you will be expected to:





1. show initiative, autonomy, and professional behavior,

- 2. deliver **English lessons** to students,
- 3. help in **different subjects** such as Math, Physical Education, Technology, Biology, or Social Science if needed (you do not need to be an expert in those subjects, as it will still be focused on English conversation).
- 4. collaborate with other teachers in lesson planning and integrate into the school dynamic,
- 5. encourage **oral practice in English** (Spanish will not be allowed in class),
- 6. motivate students through engaging materials,
- 7. give short **presentations**, prepare games and activities, and
- 8. share the culture of your own country.

If you already have teaching experience, this program will be a great chance to share your knowledge with the school community and learn from a different education system. And if you do not have previous teaching experience, you want to **gain more confidence in the classroom**, or you want to **complement your teaching practice at the school with a certification**, you might consider enrolling in the **TEFL course** we offer as well. At the end of the program, you will also receive a **Certificate of Completion** issued by the school, which can boost your resume.

SCHOOL PLACEMENT



Specific Location and Age Range of Students

Public schools are located <u>all over the regions of Madrid, Murcia, Castilla-La Mancha and</u> <u>Castilla y León</u>. Regardless of your school location, the experience will be very enriching both at a personal and professional level. If you receive a placement in a **city**, you will be able to enjoy the perks of an urban lifestyle and the leisure possibilities it offers, but accommodation and other expenses will be higher. If you get a school on the **outskirts of the city**, you will find the comfort of the city without the frenzy. The outskirts have all types of amenities within easy reach and housing is reasonably priced. If you are assigned to a school in a **town or small area** (*pueblo*), the cost of living will be cheaper and you will experience the most authentic and charming Spanish way of life, immersing yourself in a friendly culture. Opportunities to be in touch with nature are among the highlights of these areas.

At ConversaSpain, we can place you in the region of your choice, but the Education Authority of that region will be the one assigning the specific school. They will consider your age range group and location preferences whenever possible, but **we cannot guarantee your specific placement preferences** will be met, as at ConversaSpain we are not in charge of the placements. Therefore, you need to **be flexible and open-minded** in terms of the school's location and the age range of the students to have a positive experience in the program.



The Regional Education Authority will compensate you for your collaboration at the school with a **tax-free monthly stipend** of €1,000 (in the Community of Madrid), €875 (in the Region of Murcia), or €800 (in Castilla-La Mancha and in Castilla y León).

This stipend will be sent into a Spanish bank account, which means that all participants have to **open a Spanish bank account** as soon as they arrive in Spain to be paid on time.

The first stipend will be processed after your first month at school, so if you start in October, you may receive the stipend anytime during the month of November, etc. Thus, we advise that you **bring enough savings** to get you through the first two months of the program.

FAQs

For your convenience, we have gathered a list of frequently asked questions related to the program.

FEE PAYMENT

1. Why is there a fee?

The ConversaSpain Support fee is required to receive our services and join the program. We have a bilingual team of experts who works daily to deliver the best high-quality assistance to all Auxiliares de Conversación. The fee is a payment in exchange for the step-by-step information and constant guidance that you will receive before arriving in Spain and until the end of the program.

2. What's included in the fee and what's not included?

The fee includes our notorious personalized support throughout the whole process: before you arrive in Spain (information about visa applications and consulates if applicable, background checks, medical certificates, sworn translations) and during your stay in Spain (to maintain your legal status). We will also help you get settled in our beautiful country (useful tips and websites to look for accommodation, open a bank account, purchase a SIM card, etc.).

The fee does not include the costs for the background check, medical certificates, visa (if applicable), or any other documents required. It does not include travel or accommodation expenses or any other cost not specified as covered.

3. How long do I have to send the fee?

We work on a first-come, first-served basis and we accept participants as long as there are placements available. However, if you are accepted at ConversaSpain and you want to secure your experience with us, we recommend sending the fee as soon as possible. Keep in mind that this is a highly demanded program and we run out of placements every year.

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4. Are there any payment plans?


Unfortunately, there are no payment plans.

PLACEMENTS

1. When will I know my school details?

The process works as follows: first, you will need to be accepted at ConversaSpain and join us by sending the required documents. Then, your data will be sent to the corresponding Education Authority when they request it, they will assign you to a school, and send you the details directly. Some placements might entail teaching in more than one school, but the schools will be located within easy reach. It is difficult to give a specific timeframe, but our participants for the October start date can expect the placement around July.

2. I am applying for the program with someone else. Can you assure us we will be placed close to each other?

We will pass this information on to the Education Authority because we are aware of the importance this might have for you, but we cannot guarantee you will be close enough to arrange accommodation together. You will likely be placed in the same region, but you must be flexible about the specific location within the region.

3. I don't like my placement, can I be reassigned to another school?

The Regional Education Authority is in charge of the allocation process and placements are definite. Although we might ask about your preferences in terms of location and age range to inform the Education Authority, you should be open-minded and flexible about those aspects. They always try to accommodate the participants' preferences, but there are thousands of *auxiliares* and it is just not possible to accommodate everyone's choices.

4. Will Auxiliares de Conversación have holidays?

Auxiliares are entitled to the same paid holidays as the rest of the teaching staff. These include Christmas break, Easter, local and regional festivities, plus additional long weekends (*puentes*) that the district's academic calendar recognizes. As the summer break is after the end of the program, it is not included.

STAY IN SPAIN

1. How long will I be able to stay in Spain after the program finishes?


The answer to this question varies depending on your passport and documentation. If you are a successful candidate, our experts in the Welcome Team will be happy to give you all details.

2. Is Spanish required to participate in the program?

Spanish is not required to be an Auxiliar de Conversación and many of our *auxiliares* join the program with little or no knowledge of the language. However, we always recommend learning some Spanish before arriving in Spain. That is why ConversaSpain has partnered with language academies and institutes to offer Spanish courses before you arrive in Spain as well as during your stay. More details will be shared with successful candidates.

In any case, remember that, regardless of your Spanish level, you will not be walking alone and our team will provide you with support throughout the whole duration of the program.

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3. I am bringing someone else with me. Will ConversaSpain provide all of us with support?

Our support covers our participants only. You can choose to come with someone else, but ConversaSpain will not be able to provide support for them or answer any questions related to the documentation they need for Spain, as we are only experts in the documentation required for this program.

4. How much-saved money will I need by the start of the program?

It depends on your country of origin, but you should consider expenses such as visa application, medical certificate, national police clearance, apostille or legalization of documents, and flights. We recommend having around $\pounds 2,000$ to $\pounds 2,500$ saved before the beginning of the program to cover your initial expenses in Spain until you receive your first stipend: accommodation (deposit plus first month's rent), food, transportation, bills, etc. Therefore, it is important to plan accordingly and ahead of time.

5. Will the stipend be enough while I am in Spain?

The stipend should be fine to cover room and board and make ends meet (but it will also depend on each one's living standards). Keep in mind that the "minimum inter-professional salary" in Spain is €1,080 per month for 40 hours of work and that your stipend will be completely tax-free in Spain. In any case, remember that the cost of living varies depending on the region and specific location as well.

6. Does the program include medical coverage?

Yes! All of our participants will be covered. Once you join the program, you will receive further details. Medications or any issues related to pre-existing conditions may not be covered. This is why it is important to share any information about health problems at the interview, so our team can answer your questions, and give you all details upfront before you commit to the program.

7. Will I be able to get another job while in Spain?

According to the limited information we have, you could potentially get a job if you wish, but it will likely entail paying taxes both in your country and in Spain. In addition, specific rules and laws may apply in terms of the duration of the contract or the number of hours. Unfortunately, we cannot provide you with details on this topic, as it is outside of our scope. It will be your responsibility to obtain the specific information depending on your particular circumstances. In any case, if you sign a contract with an employer, your job cannot interfere with your school's schedule by any means. If this happens, your placement at the school will be canceled.

Looking to extend your stay for a second year?

One of the advantages of this program is that you will be able to renew if you have positive feedback from your school. We will give you all the necessary information and guide you through the process in due time for a fraction of the fee.

GET TEFL CERTIFIED!



If you are interested in teaching English abroad, you have probably come across the term TEFL and you most likely know what a TEFL course is about. However, have you carefully considered all the **personal and professional benefits** that getting TEFL certified can have?

TEFL stands for **Teaching English as a Foreign Language**. As a native English speaker, you already know how to speak your own language, but knowing how to teach it is entirely different. A good TEFL course will give you the necessary tools to appropriately teach your language!

It is an excellent idea to get yourself a TEFL if:

- you have no previous experience and might feel a bit overwhelmed about facing a classroom for the first time, or
- you plan to teach English for the next few years or you are considering a **future career** in the education field.

ConversaSpain gives you the opportunity to sign up for a TEFL when you join our program to help you make the most of this experience. While most academies issue 120 hours TEFL certificates, ConversaSpain offers a more polished version with a 140 hours course. Our TEFL course will take you by the hand and lead you through grammar and methodology lessons, including video observation classes, and provide you with the necessary tools and resources to manage large classes and feel more comfortable when teaching all ages. In addition, you will be assigned to a tutor who will give you feedback on written assignments and answer any questions you may have. You will have six months to complete the online TEFL course at your own pace and from the comfort of your home! Upon completion, you will receive a TEFL certificate that will certainly boost your CV and help you find future teaching opportunities. This TEFL course usually starts at the beginning of the program, so you can apply the knowledge acquired in your classes in real time. However, if you want to start the course before you arrive in Spain, we can definitely accommodate your preferences. Just let our Welcome Team know once you join the program!

With this TEFL in hand and the teaching experience you will gain at the school, you will have the **theoretical and practical knowledge** of what English teaching actually means. This is the perfect combination that will open the door for higher wages, and that will lead you to more competitive positions since some programs and job opportunities require teaching experience and training certification. Moreover, the TEFL certification never expires!


HOW DOES THE PROCESS WORK?

First of all, you will need to fill in the **online application form**. If you meet the basic requirements to participate and your profile matches what the Education Authorities are looking for in the programs available, you will be invited to an **online interview** with one of our team members.

If you successfully pass the selection process, the Welcome Team will contact you within a few days after the interview to offer you the possibility of becoming an Auxiliar de Conversación with us. You will **receive an email with basic information** about the program and a **Service Agreement**. You will have to read that information thoroughly and reply with a picture of your passport, the Service Agreement signed, and the receipt of the fee wire attached. As soon as we receive the documents and the payment, you will start enjoying the perks of becoming a *ConversaSpainer*!

You will have access to our exclusive **ConversaSpain Online Platform** where you will find a Timeline that will give you an overall idea of the process, the timings, and detailed instructions to obtain the documents required to participate in the program. This way you will know exactly what to expect and you will be able to plan ahead of time.

Keep in mind that we work on a first-come, first-served basis and that we run out of placements every year! Do not miss out on the opportunity and apply as soon as possible!
